Special events that bring families together at Churchill will always be some of our favorites!




One of our favorite annual events, Churchill's Sip & Savor, was held in



On Monday, March 4, 2024, Churchill Center & School's community held a dedication ceremony for the new Founders Circle and "Joy of Learning" sculpture honoring Founders Perry Streett and Bonnie Summers Wolfarth and Founding Director Sandi Gilligan.

Over 45 years ago, Churchill Center & School began with the dream of two local St. Louis mothers, Streett and Summers Wolfarth, fighting for a better educational opportunity for their sons who both had dyslexia. After hiring Director Gilligan, Churchill opened as a summer program with 21 students in 1978. Because of the hard work, determination and vision of these three incredible women, Churchill has grown into one of the top educational institutions for learning disabilities in the country, and a national leader for educators, administrators and schools in the field, serving more than 300 students yearly through day school, summer school and tutoring.

"As we look at Churchill's beautiful campus, we want to ensure that our Founders will always be a part of the landscape for present and future students and families. These three women are the cornerstone of our mission and all we do at Churchill. It is only fitting that we honor their transformational contributions on this campus. It will forever honor the legacy our founders built and celebrate their compassion, resilience and fortitude that established Churchill 45 years ago." - Head of School Anne Evers

This project had been three years in the making for a small committee including Churchill administration and alumni parents. In 2022, Churchill contacted local artist Abraham Mohler to commission the "Joy of Learning" sculpture.

During the ceremony, current and alumni students, as well as Anne and Perry, Bonnie and Sandi themselves, spoke to the grateful audience on what Churchill means to them. Perry, Bonnie and Sandi were then each gifted a box of 45 hand-crafted starfish to represent the 45 years since Churchill was founded. The starfish were decorated, embellished and glazed by each of our 150 students. The "Starfish Story" holds special significance at Churchill as it beautifully intertwines with Churchill's mission of individualization in focusing on "making a difference for each child" one at a time.

Anne shared, "We hope that members of our Churchill community will gather in this special space for years to come and always remember that Churchill exists today because of the hard work and dedication of Perry, Bonnie and Sandi."

The purpose of the Terri's Tutors Program is to address the educational needs of children surviving cancer, increase traditional school teachers' awareness concerning the effects of the treatments on the learning process, advocate for the educational needs of these children and educate the general community concerning the late effects of cancer treatments on children surviving cancer.

School Partnerships Program

WILSON® ACCREDITED PARTNER

Wilson Language Training® (WLT) is considered the gold standard for teaching reading to children and adults with learning disabilities such as dyslexia. Only seven private schools in the country have attained official Wilson Accredited Partner status, Churchill being one of these. In January 2024, Churchill was awarded Wilson® Accredited Partner, Best Practice Site, one of only four schools to have been designated this honor.

Churchill has implemented the Wilson Reading System® (WRS) and trained teachers through the certification process since 2005. WRS is a highly structured, remedial program that directly teaches the structure of language to students and adults who have been unable to learn with other teaching strategies, or who may require multisensory language instruction. Six Churchill Teachers earned their Level 1 Certification during the 2023-2024 school year and two are working towards Level II Certification. In addition, our five Wilson® Credentialed Trainers continuously work with Churchill faculty, as well as teachers throughout the Midwest, all year long.


